1 DAY TOUR



Situated at the confluence of the Sava and Danube rivers lies one of the oldest of the European cities and one of its greenest capitals. Being in the centre of the Balkans, Belgrade has withstood more battles than any other capital and holds the record in the number of times that it got leveled to the ground with more than forty times through its entire history. The turbulent and rich history of Belgrade is visible on/at every step. One may say that Belgrade is a living example of architecture of the past two centuries.

01 | Kalemegdan fortress

Pick up the clients in front of the hotel. Starting the sightseeing tour of the city.

One hour walking tour on the fortress with getting to know with its turbulent history.

The ancient fortress of Belgrade that guards the confluence of the Danube and Sava rivers.

Visit to the hidden tunnels of Fortress underground- optional

02 | Saborna church

The Cathedral Church of St. Michael the Archangel is a Serb Orthodox Christian church in the centre of Belgrade, Serbia. It is one of the most important places of worship in the country.

03 | Terazije square

The Belgrade's designated center. Terazije itself is a short street, connected by the King Milan Street, the main street in Belgrade, to the Slavija square, by the Nikola Pasic Square to the King Alexander Boulevard, the longest street in Belgrade, by Prizrenka street to the neighborhood of Zeleni Venac and further to New Belgrade and to the Square of the Republic.

04 | Old Royal Palace

The Old Palace, the Royal Palace of the Obrenović dynasty of Serbia, presently housing the City Assembly of Belgrade, was built between 1882 and 1884. (panoramic)

05 | New Royal Palace – The National Assembly

Located in the city center of Belgrade, in front of Pioneer's Park, on the Nikola Pašić Square. This impressive building is one of the most important achievements of recent Serbian architecture. (panoramic)

06 | The House of Flowers

Dedicated to the memory of Josip Broz Tito.

Visit to the museum - optional.

07 | St Sava Orthodox church

The largest in the Balkans, and one of the 10 largest church buildings in the world. The church is dedicated to Saint Sava, founder of the Serbian Orthodox Church and an important figure in medieval Serbia. (visit)

08 | The old bohemian quarter “Skadarlija”

The old bohemian quarter of Belgrade dates back to late 19th and early 20th century. It was back then when its „kafana“ (taverns and restaurants) were a meeting place for many of the greatest figures of the cultural scene of the period.



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
